Virginia White, a young woman bumps into Betty, an old school friend of hers, at the hotel pool where she's spending the weekend together with her boyfriend, Roger, who spontaneously invites Betty to join them on a trip to the countryside. On the train, Virginia soon becomes jealous of Betty as Roger takes an immediate interest in her attractive friend. Uncertain what to do, Virginia decides to leave the two and ignoring the frantic warnings of her travelling companions, she jumps off the train, determined to spend the night at village which she had spotted in the distance. She reaches the village and discovers that the place is deserted. Virginia beds down in what must have been the local monastery. Around midnight, the earth begins to shake and ancient tombs open, revealing the mummified corpses of old warriors.

These are the Knights Templar, once members of a medieval sect, practicing occult blood rituals, and now cursed and hooded eyeless zombies, hunting the living by the sound of their terrified heartbeats. Slowly and threateningly they advance toward Virginia who tries to run away. The hideous Blind Dead pursue the screaming young woman, finally dragging her to the ground. Late that night, Virginia's body, bearing the hideous stitch-marks of one recently autopsied, rises from its slab and kills the caretaker, drinking his blood. Later, she appears in Betty's work shop, where Nina, her assistant is manufacturing display dummies. The woman, defending herself, throws a burning stove at Virginia, who dies, letting out wild cries.

The next day, Betty and Roger go to see Professor Cantal, a medieval expert, to find out more about the Templars. He tells them that the Knights Templar returned from the crusades as servants of the Devil, practicing the Black Arts, torturing and killing young women and drinking their blood. They were finally convicted and executed for their evil deeds, their bodies hung from trees so that crows could eat out their eyes.
